INTERROGATIONS OF FORM

- A set of programs across the year, produced in response to current events, pressing topics, the state of culture in America
- Programs highlight a range of artists, scholars, activists, community leaders in conversation
- Programs aim for the highest standard of diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Programs aim to reflect, challenge, and unravel the complexities of our city, nation, and world through an artistic lens
- Programs aim to fill the gaps created by Drill Hall Programming in terms of gender, ethnicity, and diversity of discipline

Key programs include:

Community Events & Symposia (Drill Hall & Historic Rooms)

- Past programs have included day-long, large-scale celebrations in partnership with the local and national Native community (United Lenape Nations Pow Wow, 2018), Black Artists Retreat (convened in 2019 by Theaster Gates), and with 10 institutional partners across the city in recognition of the 19th Amendment centennial and the women's movement for equality (100 Years | 100 Women Project, 2020/2021)
- Symposia include day-long or multiple day investigations of Art & Social Justice (FLEXN) and the History of Violence in America (Carrie Mae Weems)

Culture in a Changing America Symposium (Historic Rooms)

- Annual day-long Symposium (normally President's Day weekend) focused on taking the pulse of culture in America, exploring topical issues from a range of perspectives
- Includes conversations, mini-performances, Artist Salons, workshops, AiR presentations, and a headliner evening event

Sunday Salons (Historic Rooms)

- 3-4 half-day intimate Salons on Sunday, designed in partnership with a singular artist or institution
- Past Salons have focused on Film (VR), The Museum as Sanctuary, Literature (black playwrights), Spoken Word, and Dance (Beauty in Ballet)

Confrontational Comedy (Veterans Room)

Annual May evening of Comedy and Conversation exploring the power of comedy to negotiate difficult topis;
 sets by 3-4 comedians, a headliner, and a conversation with all; annually hosted by Warrington Hudlin, Museum of the Moving Image

Artist Talks (Board of Officers or Veterans Room)

One-on-One conversations with Drill Hall Artists with special and sometimes unexpected moderators



Podcast Series (Audio/Digital)

- Podcast Series featuring Armory Artists, in conversation with each other and special hosts
- Partnerships include Person, Place, Thing (Randy Cohen) and Helga: The Armory Conversations (NYPR)
- 100 years 100 Women Conversation Series
